The Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (APGO) is pleased to announce the 2011-2012 APGO Academic Scholars and Leaders Program. This will be the fourteenth class of physician/students under this program.

The program's purpose is to provide interested faculty, who have major teaching responsibilities, with a vigorous curriculum addressing aspects of the educational process. Through a combination of didactic sessions, independent study, and projects supervised by course faculty and local mentors, graduates will be taught instructional theory, research design, curriculum design, multiple instructional formats and other tools necessary to be leaders in ob-gyn education.

Enclosed is a program announcement and application form. I am pleased to send you this material and look forward to your application. **Please note the deadline for applications to be received in hardcopy (no online or facsimile submissions accepted) at the APGO office is July 9, 2010.** If your application is received *after* this date, it will *not* be considered. The Advisory Committee will meet in August to review applications, with notification of selected scholars by **September 30, 2010.** (*If you are a graduate of this program, please pass this information and application to one of your colleagues whom you feel would benefit from the program.*)

With your application, you must include:

1. Your current curriculum vitae
2. Provided Statement of Support signed by your chair
3. A separate cover letter from your chair stating what he/she expects the value of your participation will be to the university/or institution.
4. A personal statement indicating why you want to participate in this course, a statement of agreement to complete course requirements, and how you intend to use the knowledge and skills gained from this experience.

If you do not have *all* of the required components, your application will not be considered.

We are very excited about the **APGO Academic Scholars and Leaders Program.** We have seen from previous classes that it greatly enhances the quality of education in obstetrics and gynecology by providing physician faculty with the skills and knowledge necessary to be outstanding teachers and educational administrators.

APGO ACADEMIC SCHOLARS AND LEADERS PROGRAM

OVERVIEW:

The APGO Academic Scholars and Leaders Program is an initiative of the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (APGO). Its purpose is to enhance education in obstetrics and gynecology by preparing ob-gyn physician faculty, through a rigorous 15-month curriculum, to possess the skills and knowledge necessary to be outstanding teachers and educational administrators. The fourteenth program will begin in January 2011.

BRIEF BACKGROUND:

Consistent with APGO's mission to enhance education in our field of medicine, this program provides a mechanism, on a national level, to draw on the success of other similar programs. Recognizing the potential value in developing true professional teachers, APGO Past-President Frank W. Ling, MD, proposed this program to industry in 1997, and it was funded by a generous endowment to the APGO Medical Education Foundation at that time.

PROGRAM PURPOSE:

The program's purpose is to improve education in the field of obstetrics and gynecology by providing motivated physician faculty with the skills and expertise to enhance all aspects of educational scholarship and leadership. In addition, graduates are expected to fulfill major educational responsibilities and positions within their medical centers.

SKILLS/KNOWLEDGE:

Upon completion of the curriculum, it is expected that graduates be skilled in:

- curriculum design
- instructional formats
- instructional theory (adult learners)
- large group instruction
- small group instruction
- clinical instruction
- feedback performance
- assessment of performance/knowledge
- educational research designs
- management/leadership skills

FACULTY:

The faculty includes six clinician-educators who represent leadership in education for APGO and five PhD educators, considered national leaders in medical education in the country. In addition, local mentors will provide significant support in education for the physician-student enrolled in this program.

CURRICULUM:

The curriculum will consist of four major components:

- curriculum and instruction
- measurement and evaluation
- research and statistics
- leadership and management

FREQUENCY OF OFFERING:

The first class began in January 1998 and classes have been held every year since. Nearly 200 scholars have graduated from the program, with another 40 expected to graduate by 2012.

FORMAT:

The program is designed to be vigorous, interesting and interactive. The didactic portion is no more than 50% of the course, with case studies, problem solving and other interactive experiences completing the curriculum. Each session is evaluated at its completion on an ongoing basis, with in-course modifications as deemed appropriate. A thesis and practicum are essential parts of this program, with completion of these elements required for graduation.

Graduation will not occur until each scholar has attended and fully participated in each educational session of the program, has completed his/her project (including writing in proper manuscript form), and satisfied all other requirements of the program. The time considerations for the physician-student will consist of four meetings: days adjacent to the annual January APGO Faculty Development Seminar, two annual CREOG & APGO Annual Meetings, and a freestanding meeting in late summer.

The majority of class time will occur in January when physician-students arrive two days preceding the January seminar. At the 2011 CREOG & APGO Annual Meeting, physician-students will be asked to arrive two days earlier than the standard meeting time. A weekend meeting will be held in August 2011. At the subsequent 2012 CREOG & APGO Annual Meeting, an additional half-day will be required for presentations and graduation. Between meetings, physician-students will engage in various assignments and projects. Though impossible to state

an estimated number of hours per week, it is anticipated that the time demands, though not overwhelming, will be considerable due to the intensive curriculum.

SELECTION OF PHYSICIAN-STUDENT:

All candidates must hold membership in APGO by October 15 of the preceding year in which they apply and have a strong interest in and evidence of participation in educational activities. Preference is given to individuals who currently fulfill defined administrative positions. The candidate must submit curriculum vitae detailing educational experience; a personal statement to include the basis for interest in the program and its proposed application, once completed; and a letter of support *and* a signed statement of commitment from the candidate's chair. This statement must include the provision of time for participation, financial support for the course, and plans for utilizing the skills and expertise gained by the candidate in the program. If you hold a title of assistant or associate clerkship or residency director, please outline your specific responsibilities, and how these responsibilities differ from the director.

In addition, a local mentor who has indicated a willingness to advise and support the candidate in his/her efforts must be named. Finally, candidates must sign an agreement wherein they pledge to satisfactorily fulfill all elements of the curriculum, including modifications as deemed necessary by the faculty, to attend all sessions at all meetings, to complete all assignments, including a practicum, a project and presentation. In addition, each candidate will endorse a clear understanding that evaluation of ongoing participation and completion of this program is solely the decision of the faculty. Failure to participate fully will lead to dismissal, for which there will be no refund of fees. The program is limited to 24 participants. *Please note that if more than one person applies from the same institution, it is assumed that, should both of these individuals be selected, they will both be able to participate.* **All applications must be complete when submitted. Facsimiles will not be accepted.**

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The cost for each physician-student will be \$3,200 for 15-month duration of the program. This will be paid in advance. In addition, the department of the physician-student is expected to provide: Travel and hotel expenses for all four required meetings; Registration fee (approx. \$425) for the 2011 Faculty Development Seminar; Registration fee (approx. \$285 each meeting) for the two CREOG & APGO Annual Meetings in March 2011 and 2012 Travel arrangements are to be made by the physician-student. The tuition fee of \$3,200 will be payable upon confirmation by APGO of the physician-student's acceptance into this program.

PROJECT CONTINUATION:

Should graduates wish to continue work on your project, they are welcome to apply for the **APGO Martin L. Stone, MD, Fund for the Advancement of Medical Education in Obstetrics and Gynecology**. This fund provides financial support for projects that expand the educational capabilities and/or measurably enhance the educational programs initiated by graduates of the APGO Academic Scholars and Leaders Program during the time of their participation in the program.

This award is unique in that only graduates from the APGO Academic Scholars and Leaders Program may apply, and the funds must be used to advance their research project or an extension of that project, which was initiated while a participant in the program. The award is granted on a competitive basis, and more than one award may be given, depending on the project's impact on the APGO membership and its budget.
