

Overview:

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Women's Health at University of Louisville School of Medicine values a culture of diversity and inclusion and is seeking a full-time academic specialist in general obstetrics and gynecology to join our team. Applicants at all levels of experience will be considered. Successful candidates exemplify uncommon integrity; they are honest, trusted, team-oriented, and live the core values of the university. The U of L Department of Ob-Gyn and Women's Health is comprised of 17 full-time physician faculty with representation of board-certified subspecialties of MFM, Gyn-Onc, and FPMRS and members with focused practice in MIGS and Advanced Family Planning. Our team also includes 3 CNM and 4 women's health NP. The department has a strong residency program of 24 residents that actively participate in section activities during their training. Current fellowship programs include FPMRS, minimally invasive gyn surgery, and reproductive endocrinology and infertility.

Responsibilities:

Primary responsibilities for this physician educator include: direct patient care, teaching and mentoring medical students and residents, and collaborating with other faculty in clinical research, quality and safety, and academic projects.

Qualifications:

Applicants must possess an MD or DO from an accredited medical school, board certification or eligibility, and qualifications to obtain an unrestricted Kentucky Medical License. Previous faculty experience in an academic setting is preferred. Salary and academic rank are based on qualifications.
